INVITATION TO BECOME THE CHURCH

*AFFIRMATION OF FAITH –

(Responsively Unison-Taken From Heidelberg Catechism) Why the words “in heaven”?

These words teach us not to think of God’s heavenly majesty as something earthly, and to expect everything needed for body and soul from God’s almighty power.

What does the first petition mean?

“Hallowed be your name” means: Help us to truly know you, to honor, glorify, and praise you for all your works and for all that shines forth from them: your almighty power, wisdom, kindness, justice, mercy, and truth.

And it means, Help us to direct all our living—what we think, say, and do—**so that your name will never be blasphemed because of us but always honored and praised.**

What does the second petition mean?

“Your kingdom come” means: Rule us by your Word and Spirit in such a way that more and more we submit to you. Preserve your church and make it grow.

Destroy the devil’s work; destroy every force which revolts against you and every conspiracy against your holy Word.

Do this until your kingdom fully comes, when you will be all in all.

What does the third petition mean?

“Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven” means:

Help us and all people to reject our own wills and to obey your will without any back talk. Your will alone is good.

Help us one and all to carry out the work we are called to, as willingly and faithfully as the angels in heaven. Amen.
